

Who is eligible?

Arrowmen who are of the age 16 by the first day of any program they choose to participate, but not 21 by the conclusion of their chosen program.

How do I register?

How much does each high adventure program cost?

The National Order of the Arrow Committee subsidizes the cost of participation in all three high adventure programs to minimize the fee paid by all participants. Because of different operational costs, each program has a separate fee.

These fees are:

Voyage - \$125 plus transportation*

Trail Crew - \$150 plus transportation*

Ocean Adventure - \$250 plus transportation*

*Excludes shuttle fee from airport.

How do I get to each high adventure base?

Wilderness Voyage

Inspired by the success of the OA Trail Crew at Philmont, Wilderness Voyage combines the Order of the Arrow's pillars of Brotherhood, Cheerfulness and Service, with the true outdoor adventure of the Northern Tier High Adventure Base. Arrowmen will spend two-weeks experiencing the inspirational surroundings in the Boundary Waters

Canoeing Area Wilderness (BWCANW), while providing truly meaningful service to a wilderness paradise.

In 2003, The OAWV received the USDA Forest Service Chief's Volunteer Award for Community Service; the highest distinction the USFS can bestow on a volunteer organization. This honor is shared by all participants: Past, Present and Future.

While the first week of the program is centered around providing meaningful cheerful service, the second week gives Arrowmen the unique opportunity to explore the historic boundary

ask the question, "When will the OA begin to provide service at the Florida Sea Base?" In 2005, those questions were answered, and the OA Ocean Adventure was born.

A two-week program based in the Florida Keys, OAOA is an opportunity to attain and advance PADI SCUBA certification in preparation for a week of service to islands and reef in the Atlantic Ocean.

Ocean Adventure has received attention from the media in the Florida Keys in recognition for underwater conservation projects performed by the participants of this young program.

As one of the most unique experiences available for Scouts everywhere, the OAOA gives Arrowmen the opportunity to explore a different kind of wilderness, while surveying underwater wildlife in consultation with the National Marine Sanctuary and the



National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA).
